



Miami-Dade County Welcomes Production with Safety & Incentives

Greater Miami is the place to [bring your next production](#)! Miami-Dade County is a popular filming location because of its diverse landscapes, infrastructure, beautiful natural light, and talented cast and crew base.

The Miami-Dade County Office of Film and Entertainment ([FilMiami](#)) is issuing film/TV/photo permits for County-owned properties, parks and unincorporated areas. Additionally, most municipalities are also issuing permits. To ensure public health, New Normal guidelines will be strictly enforced, including mask use and social distancing. The screen production industry will be required to follow "[The New Normal – A Guide for Residents and Commercial Establishments](#)" (subject to change). More information is available [online](#). Productions are adhering to the "New Normal" rules and our local cast and crew are taking the pandemic situation very seriously. Miami-Dade Police also are on hand to assist with "New Normal" rules enforcement.

Additionally, the Greater Miami Convention and Visitors Bureau has created the [#PracticeSafeSetsMiami Program](#). 100+ hotels are offering a variety of flexible, safety-first production options: from sequester/quarantine scenarios for actors and crew, to using Miami hotels as filming locations and using ballrooms for building sets in order to safely accommodate production needs.

Miami-Dade County has the capacity to support government and industry-specific health and safety protocols. It is our number one priority to keep your crews and our tenants safe to experience our facility, services, and expertise.

The Miami-Dade County Film, TV and Digital Media incentive program accommodates projects with budgets of \$500,000 or more. Additionally, the Cities of Miami Beach and North Miami have municipal screen production incentives. And all these incentives are stackable. Additionally, the State of Florida has a sales tax exemption program that saves production up to 7.5% on certain expenditures.

"We welcome Film, TV and print productions back to Miami-Dade County," said Chief of Film and Entertainment Sandy Lighterman. "The screen production industry is an economic generator, and we are seeing cast, crew and businesses go back to work in a healthy and safe way."
